If you are planning your wedding at St. James and want to use organ music, please ask our pastor for a copy of the *Wedding Music CD*. It contains brief excerpts from several pieces appropriate for your processional and recessional. (*The CD was recorded on a small keyboard, but it will give you a good idea of what it will sound like on the real organ.*)

Take some time to listen to different pieces and picture them at your wedding. Some are very commonly done, but don't limit yourself to those. Find something that you really like. Keep the CD as long as you need it, but please return it before your wedding so that others may use it, too.
